Logging In

Login to the AACSB Exchange at <http://theexchange.aacsb.edu/home>

Did you know that one set of login credentials can access all of AACSB's virtual systems? To improve member experience among our virtual platforms and tools, AACSB uses SSO (single-sign-on) technology. This means that the login information you use to register for MyAACSB is the same login information you need to access the AACSB Exchange.

- ➔ **If you are a first-time user**, proceed to [MyAACSB](#), your one-stop shop to access AACSB tools and resources. Click on Log In in the upper right corner, then click on Create a New Profile to get started. Be sure to select the correct school from the Parent Organization drop-down list – this will ensure that your account is connected to your school.
- ➔ **If you are a returning user with a new email address or school (parent organization)**, please log into your account with your most current login information. You can then update your login information on your MyAACSB account by accessing your Account and Updating Your Profile.




Update Your Preferences
